Andrew Stoeckel is Honorary Professor at the Australian National University's Centre for Applied Macroeconomic Analysis (CAMA). He is also Chief Economist (part-time) at the Department of Premier's Centre for Economic and Regional Development. Before that he was the Founding Chairman of TheCIE, a private economics research consultancy set up in 1986. TheCIE operates out of Canberra and Sydney. He joined CAMA in 2008.

He is one of Australia's leading economists and received his PhD from Duke University in 1978. His thesis was to analyse Australia's mineral boom of the seventies. He is a specialist in trade policy analysis and the global macro-economy. From 1981-86 he was the head of the (then) Bureau of Agricultural Economics in Canberra (now ABARES). He has initiated and directed programs of research on international trade that received world acclaim. He has over thirty publications to his credit.

Andrew has been a member of the NSW Innovation Council, Chairman of the NSW Marine Estate Expert Knowledge Panel and was a member of the NSW Planning Assessment Commission. He is currently researching global macroeconomic developments and the potential impact of trade wars. Over his career Andrew has gained wide experience in public policy, commercial activities and environmental issues. He has represented Australia at international forums, advised governments and private firms, prepared strategic plans for industry and developed and analysed scenarios for major corporations.
